Long Island's White Shark Research

Wednesday, June 12 at 7 PM

Our coastal waters have an abundance of sharks, all of which we know very little about. In 2015, a small group of researchers were the first to deploy a satellite tag on a juvenile great white shark off Long Island's south shore. Over the subsequent two summers, a partnership with OCEARCH enabled them to tag an additional 20 white sharks off Montauk. In this presentation, we'll learn about the continued work of the Shark Research and Education Program of the South Fork Natural History Museum.

Our speaker, **Chris Papparo** is a wildlife photographer, writer and lecturer. His passion for coastal ecology, fishing and the outdoors led him to obtain a BS in Marine Science from LIU/Southampton and currently manages the new Marine Sciences Center at Stony Brook University. Chris is also an award-winning freelance writer for several fishing, hunting, and wildlife related publications.
